YESTERYEAR.... Notes from Monday Musical History
MUSIC CLUB HAS HIGH JINKS" - The Sunday Oregonian of June 10, 1917

"It has been the custom of the club to make this [Installation of Officers] the occasion of 'Jinks'." Each officer was asked to show her fitness for her position. The new president "gave a history of her musical education and honors" and played one of her own compositions, the business ability of the financial secretary was "severely

examined," and the corresponding secretary "expressed a fear that the ink might give out."

Perhaps something we should ask of our newly elected officers?

- Giving out red packets to kids and elders will help cast away the bad luck (demon Nian) and bring good luck in.
- Besides, decorating your house with kumquat trees (symbolizing wealth & good luck), wearing your lucky color, and eating <u>lucky food</u> like rice dumplings (family togetherness), fried flour-coated



peanuts (vitality), walnut cookies (happiness), etc. are popular ways to get lucky. (Check 12 <u>Traditional Chinese New Year Foods & Symbolic Meanings</u>)
