

Update on our new "Crescendo Masterclass" - We are pleased to announce that MYS Artistic Director, Raúl Gómez-Rojas and two of Portland Opera's Resident Artists will be back for more in '24 as guest instructors in our new Masterclasses series. Our first two classes are tentatively scheduled to take place at Lincoln Hall, Portland State University on Sunday, January 21st. Raúl Gómez-Rojas will conduct the first class for strings at 1 pm. Derek Choi and Ryan Jun of Project Prelude have assembled several rising stars to perform and are partnering with us to promote the event. Our voice class will feature tenor, Roland Hawkins II, and collaborative pianist Claire Forstman who will lead our voice students performances at 3 pm. Stay tuned for more details on these exciting developments and more information to come for our Piano Masterclass.

Young Musician Showcase: Claire Youn and Katie Liu: In October we discussed several student-led nonprofits formed by MMC award winning students. Groups such as Project Prelude, the Euphonus Ensemble and others are providing programs to provide music education and are holding benefit concerts to provide awareness about various charities. This month we are showcasing MMC award winning violinists Claire Youn (2022) and Katie Liu (2023) to highlight the accomplishments of their non-profit organization, Music4Harmony. In their own October Newsletter, they discussed several initiatives to include their "Stand by Ukraine" Benefit Concert which raised \$7525 for UNICEF and included links to interviews and coverage by local news stations (KOIN6, Fox12 and KGW8). Katie updated us this week to say, "We just finished a benefit concert at Nike yesterday to help raise money for a child with a rare disease. Nita Van Pelt, 1972: "My senior year at Sunset High School in Beaverton, OR I auditioned and received a scholarship from the Monday Musical Club. I was very grateful! I had already been accepted at the <u>Oberlin Conservatory of Music</u> in Oberlin, OH on clarinet. Over the next years I earned two degrees from Oberlin and started my public-school teaching in Elyria, OH. I returned to Oregon and continued teaching mostly string orchestras but some band and general music too for 30 years in Lake Oswego. I conducted the <u>Interlude Orchestra</u> of the Metropolitan Youth Symphony for 21 years. During all those years I played clarinet in local bands and orchestras. I still play in the <u>Tilikum Chamber Orchestra</u>. After I retired, I joined the Monday Musical Club and am very happy to come full circle and help continue the tradition of scholarships for young musicians."

YESTERYEAR.... Notes from Monday Musical History
As we get ready to celebrate the holidays with our annual luncheon, it's fun
to look back at what the event was like in the past. For one thing, it was
much more elaborate than it is today. In 1983 the event was a formal
dinner party at Riverside Golf and Country Club. The invitation listed
appropriate attire as "short or long dresses, dark suits or tuxedos." The
entertainers were the Lake Oswego Windjammers, and the MMC String

Department provided background music. It was much less expensive then, too. NY steak was on the menu, and tickets for the evening, which included a gratuity, were sold for \$15 each.
