The Recital Hall is very spacious and we hope to have as many guests as possible to fill the place up! Pray for good weather, bring a friend, carpool if possible. Street parking is not difficult on the weekend right in front of Lincoln Hall on SW Broadway.

Awards:

We announced our 2024 Awards program providing application instructions on our website on December 15th. We now have 24 of 30 positions filled with three applicants on standby. We are still recruiting voice contestants with 4 of 10 positions filled so far, while the 10 instrumental and 10 piano positions are already full. We will transfer any positions not filled by voice applicants to ensure we have a total of 30 contestants before the auditions. Music Award Alumni Update:

Our website features a growing list of award recipients going back to 1950! We also receive testimonials and updates from past MMC award winners. Here is the latest entry from Derek Choi and Ryan Jun who lead Project Prelude to tell you about what they are doing:

Derek Choi (2021) and Ryan Jun (2022) discussing "Project Prelude" by Derek Choi:

I was a 2021 Monday Musical Club of Portland Scholarship recipient (violin), and Ryan was a 2022 recipient (violin). Since then, we have become the joint leaders of the student-run nonprofit, Project Prelude. I serve as Executive Director, and Ryan serves as Musical Director.

Project Prelude engages high school musicians to bring cost-free group violin programs to over 80 underserved youth in the Portland Metropolitan area each year. The organization was founded in 2016 by Isabelle Zheng and Cammie Lee with the Metropolitan Youth Symphony as our fiscal sponsor. We feel incredibly lucky to continue the great work that has been done. Since taking on our roles, we have launched new programs including the Coda Fellowship (in partnership with the international Back to BACH Project) to bring private instruction to young students, and the Crescendo Masterclasses (in partnership with the Monday Musical Club of Portland) to expand opportunities for pre-professional growth - and to help more students prepare for their MMC award auditions! This season, Project Prelude will



launch into a new region in the New York Metropolitan Area, which will have a team of 13 volunteers.

We are also equally passionate about the violin! This past summer, Ryan served as concertmaster of Carnegie Hall's NYO2, leading the orchestra on tour to the Dominican Republic with conductor Joseph Young. I served as concertmaster of the Kennedy Center Summer Music Institute Orchestra (where Ryan is a fellow alum), with conductor Daniel Bartholomew-Poyser from the San Francisco Symphony.

Here at home, we have collectively contributed over 11 seasons to the Portland Youth Philharmonic! We are grateful to PYP for bringing us a shared joy of orchestral music, and teaching us the skills of commitment and dedication. We will also forever cherish the lifelong relationships that we found in the PYP community.

YESTERYEAR.... Notes from Monday Musical History



Did you know that in the past, the Monday Musical Club had a nationally known chorus? The chorus was first organized in 1910 and throughout the years entertained folks



throughout the country and in Canada as well as in Portland. In 1931, the chorus sextet won the Gilbert and Sullivan Cup at a choral competition in Victoria, British Columbia. Also, in the 30's, the chorus entertained at the National Convention of Music Clubs in San Francisco. Over the years, the club has sung in various Portland venues as well - the Oaks Amusement Park, the Meier and Frank Auditorium, the Portland Art Museum, the YWCA, and many others. In the 1970's, the chorus became inactive, as it is now, but it was reactivated in 1977. Here's hoping it will one day be possible for Monday Musical to have a chorus once again.
