About Us

Monday Musical Club is celebrating it's 120th Anniversary this year since it was formed in 1904. The Club has been providing grants and loans to students since 1932. Award records have been maintained consistently since 1974 and all known past award recipients names can be found on our website: <a href="https://www.pdxmmc.org">www.pdxmmc.org</a>

We entered into 2024 with a new vision statement: "Monday Musical Club's vision for 2024 is to expand the organization with new members, raise money for music awards, provide music education, and empower our community to thrive though music." We've successfully achieved that goal in a number of ways. We've expanded the organization by reaching out to working people who can't attend our events by adding a new "Associate" Member level for just \$12 per year. We hope to attract more parents, teachers and professional people into the organization and provide access to them through newsletters and more contact. We've initiated a campaign to raise more money by reaching out to donors from outside the organization to give at various levels, and offered a chance for them to provide names to our awards, to include the new 2024 Susan Patsakis Award for Vocal Excellence. In 2024 we've expanded our musical education program with our first series of Masterclasses and strengthened our partnerships with the Portland Opera and the Metropolitan Youth Symphony by engaging with their artists to provide instruction. We will continue to reach out to artists in the community to help collaborate with us in music education.

### Our 2024 Adjudicators:

Our award recipients were selected by professional adjudicators at auditions held at the Community Music Center in Portland, Oregon on April 21st, 2024. Adjudicators this year included Oregon Symphony cellist, Trevor Fitzpatrick (Instrumental); Portland State University Professor Emeritus, Christine Meadows (Voice); and Pianist and Master Teacher, Dr. Thomas Otten (Piano). THE FOSTER-LAFORD AWARD FOR THE MOST OUTSTANDING VOCAL PERFORMANCE GOES TO:

Taylenne Juliana Ubieta Johnson

SOPRANO AGE 20 UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND TEACHER: DR. NICOLE LEUPP HANIG

Soprano, Taylenne Juliana Ubieta Johnson was born and raised in Salem, Oregon where she grew up listening and singing music that represents her heritage: Rhythm and Blues on one side of the family and Mariachi and Bolero on the other. She began taking voice lessons in high school in order to better imitate the sounds made by her father who sings everything from Mariachi to Italian Opera.

Inspired by Whitney Houston and Maria Callas, Ms. Ubieta hopes to one day sing the roles of Norma and Madama Butterfly. She is currently a sophomore at University of Portland, where she studies with Dr. Nicole Leupp Hanig. In addition to advancing to the final round of the Portland Chamber Orchestra Young Artist Competition, Ms. Ubieta has advanced to the NW Regional level in the National Association of Teachers of Singing Competition.

Kaylee Nah, 14, is a freshman at Sunset High School in Portland, Oregon. She has studied the violin under Hae-Jin Kim since the age of five. Kaylee has been in PYP since 2018 and has served as the concertmaster of the Young String Ensemble and the principal second violin of the Portland Youth Conservatory Orchestra. Kaylee is now playing in the Portland Youth Philharmonic orchestra for her third year. She also enjoys playing chamber music in Camerata PYP, the PYP sextet, and the PYP quartet.



Kaylee won 1st place in the OMTA Jeannette Scott Briggs Scholarship Competition in 2022 and was the Oregon state winner of the MTNA Junior String Competition for both the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons. She also won the MTNA 2023-2024 NW Division and placed as one of the seven national finalists. Additionally, she was chosen to serve as the concertmaster for the 2024 OMEA All-State Symphony Orchestra and became a winner for the 30th MetroArts Young Artists Debut! Competition in 2024. Recently, Kaylee also won the OSAA/OMEA State Solo Championships for violin and chamber ensemble.

Kaylee attended the Heifetz International Music Institute in the summer of 2023. In the summer of 2024 she will be attending the Interlochen Arts Camp with a full scholarship. She has played in masterclasses for artists Benjamin Beilman, Carol Sindell, Sunmi Chang, and the Modigliani Quartet. While preparing for the Monday Musical Club award competition this year she also participated in a masterclass with Raúl Gómez-Rojas hosted by Monday Musical Club and Project Prelude. Eden Choi


VIOLINIST AGE 15 LAKE OSWEGO HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER: CAROL SINDELL

A frequent guest with her uncle's eclectic chamber music group "3 Leg Torso," she has also sparkled audiences with the Brent Follis Trio, Tom Grant Trio, George Mitchell Trio, Bill Athens Trio, Christopher Brown Quartet, Brent Jensen Quartet, and many other jazz musicians.

In 2023, state representative Maxine Dexter hosted Minntah to open the Oregon State Legislative Session with a Puccini aria. Several months later, Minntah captured the state soprano title at the Oregon State Activities Association Championship. 

As a 2023 Luna Composition Lab Fellow, she debuted her piece "Waluga" at the Mannes School of Music and became the first Luna Composition Lab Fellow with the Oregon Symphony. A 2024 YoungArts winner in Voice/Singer-Songwriter and Classical Music/Composition, Elaina's pieces won honors at state levels. Her works were performed by the Oregon Symphony, International Contemporary Ensemble, Portland Youth Philharmonic, and the Seattle Symphony's: Dear Humanity Concert.



Elaina has studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music, Colburn School, and the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music. She is a member of the Young Composers Project and received the U.S. Presidential Award for Academic Excellence. Elaina is a Youth Roying Reporter at All Classical Portland/ICAN Radio Station. She also won first place in the American Protégé International Piano and Strings Competition, second place in OMEA District Competition, and third place in the OSAA State Solo Competition. 

Thomas Otten, a California native born of German-American parents, has been hailed by the New York Times as "an extremely original player who puts a formidable technique at the service of his ideas."

He made his debut at age seventeen with the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center, and has since developed a global profile through performances in New York, Washington, Los Angeles, St. Petersburg, Sydney, Munich, Frankfurt, and Milan, including such venues as Carnegie Hall, Alice Tully Hall, Severance Hall, the German Embassy, and the National Press Club. He has given guest artist recitals and masterclasses at top music schools and conservatories, such as the Rimsky-Korsakov St. Petersburg State Conservatory in Russia, the Munich Hochschule für Musik in Germany, as well as the Eastman School of Music, The Juilliard School, and Oberlin Conservatory in the U.S.

A recipient of numerous national and international awards, Dr. Otten has studied with artist teachers John Perry and Nelita True, and worked intensively with biomechanics expert <u>Barbara Lister-Sink</u>. He has been on the faculties of the International Young Artists Project (Italy), Saarburger Serenaden International Music Festival(Germany), the American Institute of Musical Studies (Austria), and the Kent/Blossom Festival (Ohio), as well as concerto soloist at the Chautauqua and Brevard Summer Festivals. He has been a member of competition juries in the U.S. and abroad, and was founder of the Kent Piano Seminar in Ohio, as well director of the UNC Liszt Festival, UNC Etude Festival, and the Ginastera Centennial Celebration in North Carolina. His discography includes transcriptions of Franz Liszt and a premiere recording of etudes by African American composer <u>Leslie Adams</u>. He is committed to diverse music of our time, having also premiered works by electronic music expert <u>Frances White</u> and jazz pianist/composer Joe Utterback.

Dr. Otten holds the title of Emeritus Professor, having retired in 2018 as Piano Area Chair from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; previously he was Chair of Piano at Kent State University in Ohio. He now resides in Portland, OR, where he has established himself as a master teacher and concert artist, touring the Pacific Northwest through the auspices of the OMTA Tholen Enrichment Project and WSMTA Visiting Artist Program. His former students include prize-winning concert artist Andrew Tyson, along with other professional musicians who are active throughout the country. His collaborations include the Miami and Vega String Quartets, violinist Richard Luby, as well as baritone Marc Callahan and soprano Louise Toppin.
