My name is Fedor Chayka, and I am an undergrad researcher at the University of Oregon, majoring in chemistry and mathematics with a music minor. I got a third prize in the 2023 Monday Musical Club of Portland contest... I am reaching out to you today on behalf of the University of Oregon iGEM team, which is part of an international synthetic biology competition where students design and build synthetic biology projects.... My role in the team is developing a computer-based tool to design aptamers that bind to desired target proteins. Participation in the competition gives everyone in the team invaluable experience in research design and bioengineering and allows us to present our research on a global stage...
